GOOD TOGETHER

Plants that support each other by improving growth, pest control, or flavor.

Examples:

- Tomatoes + Basil
- Carrots + Onions
- Beans + Corn + Squash (The Three Sisters)



AVOID TOGETHER

Plants that compete for nutrients or may stunt each other's growth.

Examples:

- Tomatoes + Potatoes
- Beans + Onions
- Cabbage + Strawberries



HELPFUL FLOWERS

Flowers that attract beneficial insects, improve pollination, and deter pests.

Examples:

- Marigold – Repels pests
- Nasturtium – Attracts beneficial insects
- Calendula – Attracts pollinators



HELPFUL HERBS

Herbs that deter pests, improve flavor, and support garden health.

Examples:

- Basil – Repels flies & mosquitoes
- Rosemary – Repels cabbage moths
- Dill – Attracts beneficial insects



COMMON PLANTS & THEIR COMPANIONS



PLANT	GOOD COMPANIONS	AVOID	NOTES
Tomatoes	Basil, Carrots, Onions, Marigolds	Potatoes, Fennel, Cabbage	Basil improves flavor and may repel pests.
Carrots	Onions, Leeks, Lettuce, Radishes	Dill	Onions help repel carrot flies.
Lettuce	Carrots, Radishes, Strawberries	Celery, Parsley	Shade from taller plants helps in hot weather.
Beans (Bush or Pole)	Corn, Squash, Cucumber, Marigolds	Onions, Garlic, Fennel	Fixes nitrogen in soil and supports heavy feeders.
Cucumbers	Beans, Peas, Radishes, Nasturtiums	Potatoes, Sage	Nasturtiums attract beneficial insects and deter pests.
Cabbage (Brassicas)	Dill, Rosemary, Celery, Onions	Strawberries, Tomatoes, Pole Beans	Herbs help repel cabbage moths and pests.
Corn	Beans, Squash, Pumpkin (Three Sisters)	Tomatoes	Beans climb stalks; squash shades soil and holds moisture.
Potatoes	Beans, Corn, Marigolds, Horseradish	Tomatoes, Pumpkins	Marigolds may help reduce soil pests.
