

Herb Companion Planting Chart



Herb	Grows Well Near	Garden Use / Benefit	Notes / Caution
Basil 	Tomatoes, Peppers, Eggplant, Oregano	Improves flavor of tomatoes and peppers; may help repel flies and mosquitoes.	Avoid planting near rue. Needs warm soil.
Dill 	Cucumbers, Brassicas (cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower), Lettuce	Attracts beneficial insects (hoverflies, lacewings, parasitic wasps); supports healthy cucumber growth.	Avoid planting near carrots and other Apiaceae (fennel, carrots, parsley).
Parsley 	Tomatoes, Asparagus, Rosemary, Chives	Attracts beneficial insects; may improve flavor of nearby plants; good ground cover.	Biennial—may flower in second year; allow some to flower for pollinators.
Chives 	Carrots, Tomatoes, Rosemary, Roses	Repels aphids and some pests; improves growth and flavor of nearby plants.	Avoid planting with peas and beans.
Thyme 	Brassicas (cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower), Tomatoes, Strawberries	Helps deter cabbage worms and other pests; attracts beneficial insects.	Low-growing and drought tolerant; give good air circulation.
Sage 	Carrots, Brassicas, Strawberries	Repels cabbage moths and carrot fly; supports healthy plant growth.	May inhibit growth of cucumbers. Prefers well-drained soil.
Rosemary 	Beans, Carrots, Brassicas, Sage	Improves growth and flavor; repels carrot fly and some beetles.	Prefers drier soil and good drainage; avoid overwatering.
Oregano 	Tomatoes, Peppers, Brassicas	Repels pests; attracts beneficial insects; enhances flavor of nearby plants.	Spreads moderately—give space to avoid crowding other herbs.
Cilantro 	Tomatoes, Peppers, Cucumbers	Attracts beneficial insects; may help deter spider mites; good in vegetable gardens.	Bolts in heat—succession plant for continuous harvest.
Mint 	Cabbage, Tomatoes, Peppers, Fruit Trees	Strong deterrent to ants, fleas, aphids, and some pests; refreshing ground cover.	Spreads quickly—best in containers or in-ground with barriers.
